1. The Rock and Roll Hall of Fame and Museum

2. **One Cleveland Center** is the fifth largest skyscraper located in downtown Cleveland, Ohio, following Erieview Tower. The building has 31 stories, rises to a height of 450 ft (137 m), and is located at 1375 East 9th Street. It has about 614,000 square feet (57,000 m<sup>2</sup>) of office space.

6. **Public Park: 3 Public Square, Cleveland, OH 44113.**  
**Soldiers' and Sailors' Monument** commemorates the Civil War. A tall column topped with a statue of the "Goddess of Liberty" signifies loyalty to the nation. Four bronze groupings at base depict Navy, Cavalry, Infantry and Artillery. In the base lists 9,000 Civil War veterans. There are also the **busts of James Barnett**, Levi Scofield and officers killed in action. Sculptor, Levi T Scofield

8. The Mall

9. One of the many treasures in the **Cleveland Public Library** is the work of artist Ora Coltman. Coltman was a painter, sculptor, block printer, muralist, teacher, and writer. Exhibitions of his work took place at the Art Institute of Chicago, the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Art, the Cleveland Museum of Art, and the Butler Institute of American Art in Youngstown, Ohio. His mural for the Cleveland Public Library is called *Dominance of the City*.
10. The **Terminal Tower** is a landmark skyscraper located on Public Square in downtown Cleveland, Ohio. It was built during the skyscraper boom of the 1920s and 1930s, and was the second-tallest building in the world when it was completed. The Terminal Tower stood as the tallest building in North America outside of New York City from its completion in 1930 until 1964.
11. The rotunda building of the **Cleveland Trust (Ameritrust)** complex is at East Ninth Street and Euclid Avenue. Constructed in 1905 and opened in 1908, the main feature of the rotunda building is the immense stained-glass dome which sits atop two mezzanine levels above the main banking floor. The dome is not a Tiffany glass piece although it does share similarities with the works of Tiffany Studios. The artist of the murals on the upper mezzanine level, Francis Millet, lost his life on the Titanic.
