

Bunny Patch Shirts

Use iron-on patches to cover up stains on favorite shirts or to decorate a plain one! We were expecting to find and use the old-fashioned denim patches we grew up with, but we were pleasantly surprised to see that the world of iron-on patches has come a long way! Find decorative patch squares in 8x10 sheets that you can cut out and customize at your local craft store.

What You'll Need:

- *Shirts – you can buy plain shirts, or like we did, use a favorite shirt that has a stain on it
- *Iron on patches
- *Bunny template (optional, see below)
- *Iron

Preparation:

- *Gently trace your shape onto the back of the iron on patches and cut them out. Since it's April and nearing Easter, we used the bunny template (see below) as a stencil and cut out a bunny silhouette to iron on to our white t-shirt.

Activity:

- *Since our shirt had multiple stains, we added some extra flower patches we found on sale to cover up the smaller stains all around.
- *The boys couldn't be left out...a favorite t-shirt with my son's name on it was "ruined" until we found a camo patch that I cut into star shapes and ironed on.
